Suggestions and Actions:

- *To introduce more after school clubs to the children with a particular focus on Year 3*
- *To speak to the Kent free milk provider, to see if they would stop using plastic straws*
- *To introduce the Accelerated Reader scheme. One parent mentioned this and the school has previously investigated this for use in the school. However, after weighing up the pros and cons, it was decided to not use this scheme at WR.*
- *More sporting activities at lunchtime. We are currently training our Year 6 children to be "Playleader Ambassadors", which will result in more sporting activities being carried out in the KS1 playgrounds.*
- *Nature garden to be used more often. In Term 1, this area was used for many Science lessons across the school. The nature and allotment area were not used as much this term due to topics not lending themselves to the use of this outdoor space. As the weather improves, we plan to use the garden more fully next year. Additionally, we already have a few competitions in the pipeline looking at wildlife and growing plants*
